## **Guest Speakers**

#### Dr. Sherene McHenry, CSP – Keynote Speaker

Before leaving to speak full time, Sherene spent three decades on college campuses. She earned her Bachelors Degree in Business from Wingate University and her Masters in Student Personnel Services from the University of South Carolina. She then worked in career services where she fell in love with teaching and the "lightbulb of learning". Sherene then earned her PhD in Counselor Education from the University of Wyoming and was a graduate professor for almost 20 years.

She's written multiple books including The Busy Student's Guide to College and Career Success, Pick, and Navigate: Understanding the Five Types of People. She also authored a syndicated column on leadership and workplace issues and has been quoted in numerous publications including The Wall Street Journal which highly impressed pause... her mother. Sherene's spoken on three continents and proudly served a wide range of clients including Google, PricewaterhouseCoopers and the University of Michigan. When she's not working, she's usually downhill skiing in the winter or out on the lake in the summer.

#### Eric Zarnikow, Illinois Student Assistance Commission (ISAC)

Eric Zarnikow is Executive Director of the Illinois Student Assistance Commission, the state's college access and financial aid agency. ISAC provides comprehensive, objective, and timely information on education and financial aid for students and their families – giving them access to the tools they need to make the educational choices that are right for them. Then, through the state's scholarship and grant programs ISAC administers, including the state's flagship Monetary Award Program, ISAC can help students make those choices a reality.

Eric is a former Associate Administrator at the U.S. Small Business Administration, where he led the office of Capital Access, responsible for all the agency's programs and operations concerning financial assistance to small businesses, 800 employees and a \$90 billion loan and investment portfolio. Prior to his work with the SBA, Eric spent over 25 years in the private sector, including serving as Senior Vice President, Chief Risk Officer and Treasurer at ServiceMaster. Eric serves on several commissions and is a former trustee of The College Board. A certified public accountant, Eric received his bachelor's degree from Iowa State University and MBA from Drake University.

## Amanda Fijal, Midwest Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators (MASFAA)

Amanda Fijal is the Assistant Vice President of Enrollment and Student Advancement and Executive Director of Financial Aid at the University of Chicago. She has been in financial aid for 25 years, the last fourteen at University of Chicago. Amanda holds a B.S. in Psychology and M.Ed. in Higher Education Administration from Loyola University Chicago. She has served the Illinois and Midwest Associations of Student Financial Aid Administrators in a number of capacities, including ILASFAA President and Treasurer and MASFAA Treasurer, Conference Program Chair and Local Arrangements Co-Chair. She is currently MASFAA President.

#### Justin Draeger – President & CEO, NASFAA

Justin is president and CEO of the National Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators. He serves as the primary voice of NASFAA and as the liaison between the association members, the U.S. Congress, federal agencies and the media. Most of Justin's career has been devoted to assisting disadvantaged populations achieve their educational goals and better their communities. Since 2002, Justin has been engaged in either administering, interpreting, communicating, or developing student financial aid policy. His prior experiences include working as a financial aid director, regulatory and policy analyst, and spokesperson. He has held senior positions overseeing government relations, communications, and policy work. Justin is frequently quoted in the press and has appeared on The Today Show on NBC, National Public Radio, APM's Marketplace, Fox Business News, CNBC, and C-SPAN, and is often guoted in national news outlets. Justin currently serves on the boards of directors of Baker College, the Association Mutual Health Insurance Company, the Northwood Education Foundation, and other organizations that promote health and education. He earned his undergraduate from Brigham Young University and his MBA from Baker College. Justin lives in Fairfax, VA with his wife and three children, where he spends his free time shuttling children to various events, bicycling, motorcycling, playing racquetball, and running.





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
